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1.Skilling Initiative for Saubhagya project – Progress so far:

SAUBHAGYA Project Skill Training has been in progress in 139 Districts across six focused states of Assam, Bihar, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha and Uttar Pradesh between the two Job Roles of Lineman Distribution (Multi Skilled) and Technical Helper. Out of total allocation of 20914 by National Skill Development Council (NSDC) **14524** workforce engaged in execution of project have been skill trained. The SAUBHAGYA Project aims at achieving Universal Household Electrification providing last mile connectivity including electricity connection to all households.

Sanjay Kumar, S/O Ramswrup Prasad Yadav, age 32 years, Banka, Bihar, born in a small town, he belongs to a family of six, with only one person earning and being a part of the low income group he decided to change his fate by himself. Working from a young age he took over responsibilities as they piled onto him. Sanjay was a keen learner and started working in electrical field. He said "I always wanted to learn more, so that I could grow and earn better."



With all the knowledge he gained, he started working as a lineman and got an opportunity to work with M/S RABISH ENGINEERING PVT LTD and is working there since last twelve years. Initially, he was offered very low salary because of lack of experience and technical knowledge. Desirous to learn more and improve his Skills; while talking to his colleagues few months ago, he came to know about Saubhagya RPL Training Program launched in the district of Banka. Under Saubhagya Yojana, all the people who were working as Lineman were getting an opportunity to improve their skills and get trained. His contractor referred his name to Mosaic Workskills Pvt. Ltd, who is the training partner for this program. He was called for a formal interview and he was shortlisted for this training. He says "The training took me through the different methods, safety precautions, different electrical equipment and tools which can be used to do his work. In addition to this, my interpersonal skills were also groomed which helped me create a positive attitude towards my work."

Today he feels more confident. The Skill enhancement helped him in many ways and most importantly the way he used to work earlier. Various safety precautions and small tips that are a part of the training helped him to work more effectively and gave him results as anticipated. Sanjay strongly feels that his skills and knowledge have improved and he has become more attentive and responsible towards his job role. He actively participates with the team members and is always ready to help others at work. The turning point for him was when he got a salary hike because he is certified for his skills.

He is very thankful to the Government of India for launching such a great scheme which helped him enhance his working skills and Power Sector Skill Council for the certification.

"It is an excellent program – I learnt a lot. I am inspired to rethink the way I work and I am Skilled now!" says Lalan Kumar, 38 years old. He belongs to Barhaiya, Ward No-16, Dist-Lakhisarai, a small town in Bihar. He has seven members in his family, he is the only member earning for their living. Lalan started working with less paid jobs in electrical field. Despite being 8th pass, nothing stopped him to learn and grow. At a young age he gave up his studies to take up house responsibilities, but in the back of his mind he always wanted to do something for a better livelihood.



He says "All the knowledge I gained with years of experience gave me a chance to work as a lineman with M/S Ranjan and Company in 2018, after I was fed up of small contractual jobs which I used to do earlier." He added, "Few months back, I noticed a few people in my company were talking about a training program started by our government. Upon enquiring I came to know about Saubhagya RPL Training Program, launched in the district of Banka which trained working Linemen to improve and enhance their skills." Keen to know how it will help him to improvise his skills, he approached his contractor, who referred his name to the training partner for this program, Mosaic Workskills Pvt. Ltd.

Lalan says, "It is a different feeling when you are skilled. You are respected and looked upon. I am more confident and strongly believe that some knowledge is better than no knowledge. I cannot complete my education but I can give a better life to my family. I am sending my three kids to school and educating them."

5. PSSC Skilling Initiative Scale up at NTPC:

Skilling initiative for the job role in power generation areas of Power Sector Skill Council were rolled out at Easter Region Plants of NTPC, one of the largest power generation company in the world and a major Maha Ratna PSU in India. It may be recalled that NTPC has been an important stake holder of Power Sector Skill Council, enabling it development required NOS/QP. The skilling initiative at NTPC had begun about a year ago at their plants in Dadri and Badarpur in NCR Region. It was followed by roll out of similar initiative in Western Region Power Plants at Solapur and Mouda in Maharashtra.
